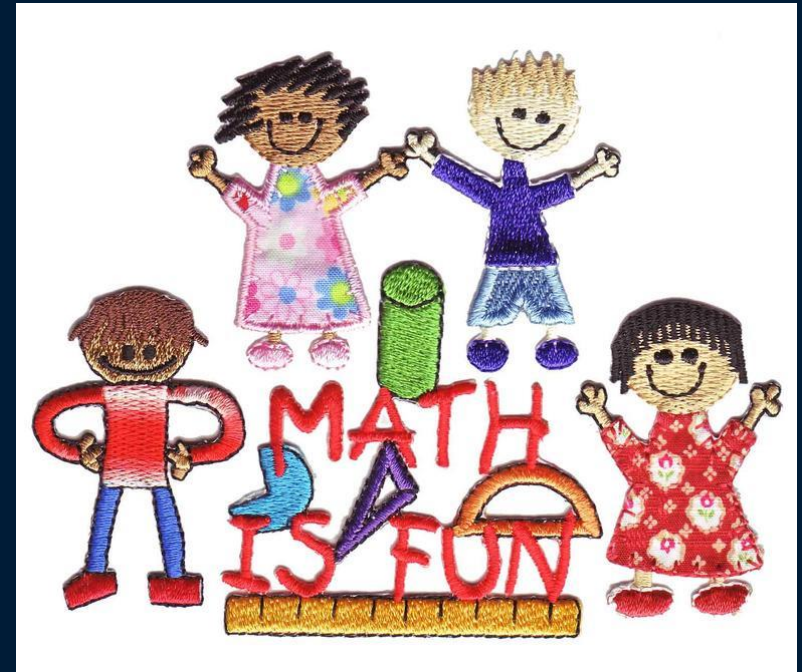

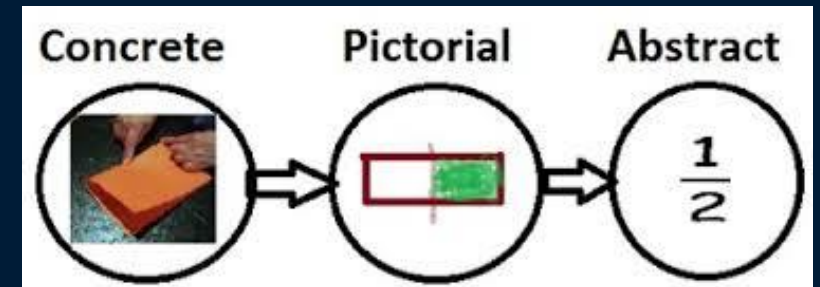
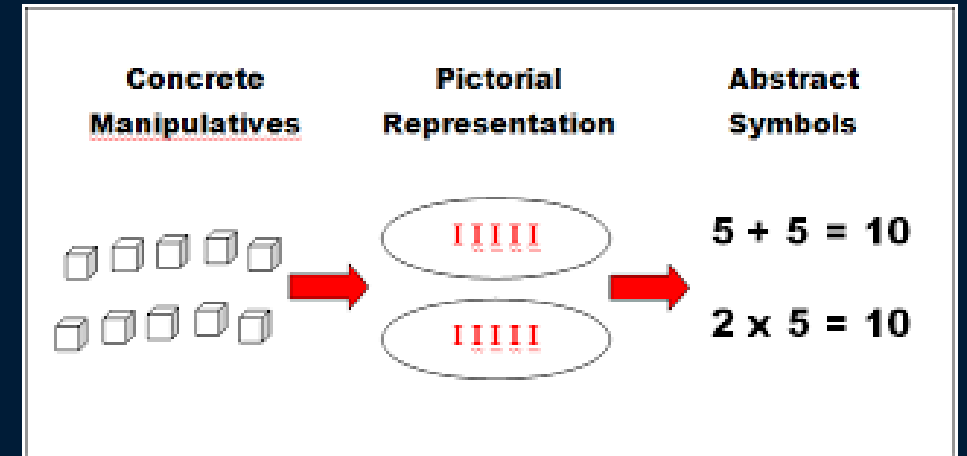

Maths ideas

- Board games and card games
- Maths in the environment e.g. road signs, number plates, door numbers, prices in the supermarket
- Measuring items at home – comparing heights/lengths
- Cooking/Measuring using scales
- Using Lego for patterns/shapes/sequences
- Using a calendar – discussing days/months/years
- Looking at the weather and comparing temperatures

Handwriting

Our main aim is for your sons to develop a clear and easy handwriting style which can become fluent and automatic.

Currently the children's learning is focused on:

- Holding a pencil correctly
- Using the correct posture for writing
- Forming upper and lower case letters correctly with clear ascenders and descenders

By the end of the year, the majority of the boys will be developing a neat style of handwriting using the joins they have learnt in class.

Spellings

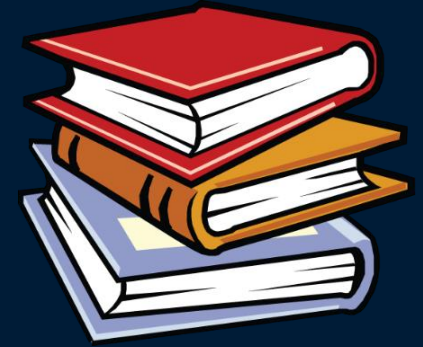
Spellings will be introduced after half term.

Practise them daily -Look, Cover, Spell, Check

Alongside the list of words, they will be tested with one or two dictated sentences using the key spelling words taught

Reading



Your son will bring home a book to read three times a week.

We may ask you to re-read pages which they have read in school to consolidate content, vocabulary or a reading skill.

Please only read allocated pages with your child and write a brief comment.

Reading



- Encourage your son to read in a clear, audible voice, pausing for all punctuation.
- Ask your son questions about what he has read so far, see if he can recall the storyline and character names.
- There are two main types of questioning:
 - Retrieval – directly taking answers from the text
 - Inferential – why they think characters might be acting in a certain way / saying certain things. Can your son fill the gaps?
- Make predictions about what they think will happen next! (Using clues from the story)
- Encourage expression when reading all text types.

Creative Writing

- Have fun!
- Take the children to new places to build a foundation for their creativity and imagination
- Magpie new or exciting words from books
- Discuss what makes a book exciting and why they like the characters
- Continue to read traditional tales
- Discuss the beginning, middle and end of stories

Writing Ideas

- Write instructions e.g. game, recipe
- Draw a picture and write a few sentences about it
- Recount an outing
- Write a letter to a family or friend
- Copying facts from a book
- Lists, e.g. shopping
- Write about their favourite part of a story
