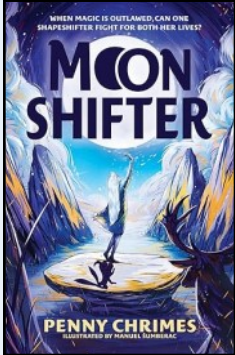

When magic is outlawed, can one shapeshifter find the strength to fight for both her lives?

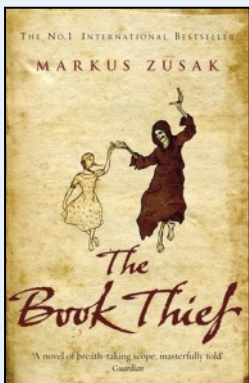

Liesel, a nine-year-old girl, is living with a foster family on Himmel Street. Her parents have been taken away to a concentration camp.

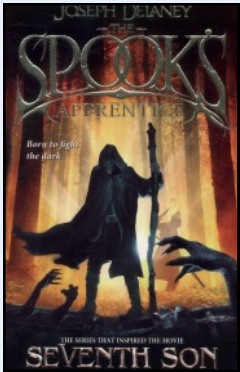
Liesel steals books. This is her story and the story of the inhabitants of her street when the bombs begin to fall. Some important information - this novel is narrated by death.

'Someone has to stand against the dark. And you're the only one who can' For years, the local Spook has been keeping the County safe from evil.

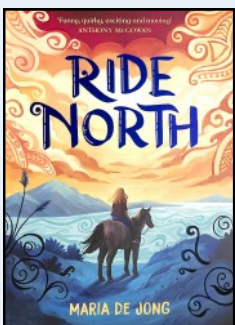
Now his time is coming to an end, but who will take over?


Twelve-year-old Folly is angry and grieving for her mum. She isn't ready for Dad's plans for a new life in Auckland with his new girlfriend.

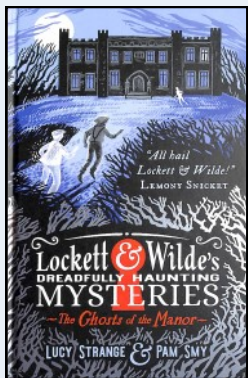
But then a spur-of-the-moment choice sets danger on their tail. Girl and horse must fight to survive together – to the very end of the road.

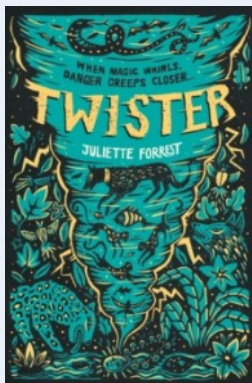


Lockett and Wilde's Dreadfully Haunting Mysteries

But there's a dark foe on the hunt for this necklace, a baddie who wears a coat crawling with creatures and who might have something to do with her father's sudden disappearance...





On the wall

The world's greatest detective, Hercule Poirot, must identify the prime suspects from among the small but disparate group of remaining passengers—before the murderer decides to strike again.



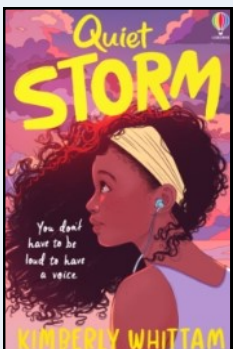

Almost Sunset

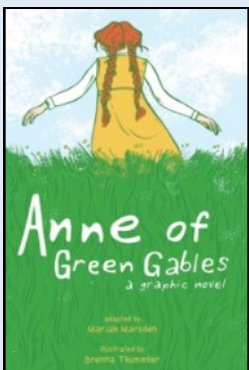
